2. Compounding by penalty provision has been added Rajasthan Amendment in the Factories Act, 1948 for decriminalisation of first offense.

3. The Rajasthan Boiler Attendants' Rules, 1954 and the Rajasthan Boiler Operation Engineers' Rules, 1967 has been repealed on introduction of Central Rules.
