## **FALL IN WAGES**

# 1856. PROF. MANOJ KUMAR JHA:

Will the Minister of Labour and Employment be pleased to state:

- (a)whether it is a fact that wages in the country have fallen down to pre-pandemic levels as stated by the International Labour Organisation's Global Wage Report 2022-23;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the reasons behind the recent decline in wage rates in the country;
- (d)the data related to changing wage rates in the country during the last five years; and
- (e)whether Government has data related to the impact that decline in wages has caused on the labourers in the country?

# MINISTER OF STATE FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI RAMESWAR TELI)

(a) to (e): No Sir, The Global Wage Report 2022-23 includes analysis of Indian preliminary earnings estimates processed by ILOSTAT data from 2018/2019 to 2020/2021 (Source: Periodic Labour Force Survey) at the time of report production.

The details of nominal wage levels are given as under:

The minimum wages is fixed/ revised periodically for the Scheduled Employment for Central Sphere establishments. Variable Dearness Allowance (VDA) is issued twice in a year to be effective from 01<sup>st</sup> April and 01<sup>st</sup> October respectively.
